



Pupil Premium Funding

A Guide for Families and Students

Pupil Premium funding is additional funding school receives to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged pupils. At North Cestrian School, every student eligible for the funding will benefit by having a personal Pupil Premium Passport. The passport will guide staff on how best to give extra investment for students.

Who is eligible for Pupil Premium funding?

Pupils who receive free school meals (FSM) or even if the pupil qualified for free school meals at primary school.
Children who have been adopted from care or have left care.
Children who are looked after by the local authority.
Children whose parents serve in the armed forces.

Why does the school receive the funding?

Disadvantaged pupils face additional challenges in reaching their potential at school. Our job is to identify and remove any barriers to learning. We work hard to ensure pupils are **school ready** by providing support getting to school, ensuring pupils have the correct uniform, stationery, resources and have access to supportive staff, to name but a few initiatives.

What is the main aim of the funding?

Investments to **raise attainment** and remove barriers both in-class and beyond school. We do this by raising the feeling of belonging in **their** school. Students engage in all aspects of school life which raises the quality of the relationship between disadvantaged students and the pupil premium co-ordinator, teachers-tutors-teaching assistants, and their peers and peer mentors. The funding is also used enhance personal development which links to Cestrian Behaviour and Cestrian Character, this includes mental health, better attendance, extra-curricular opportunities, trips and cultural capital, and future careers.
